We specialize in the care, treatment and rehabilitation of injured or orphaned native fur bearing mammals and birds. To date, our facility has treated and released thousands of mammals and birds representing over 200 species. Our facility is fully licensed and inspected, meeting all government regulations.

Rehabilitation and release into the wild of injured and orphaned wildlife.

Research to develop the knowledge and understanding necessary for conservation and management of wildlife resources in a complex and continually changing biological, social and political environment.
